Vaccine equity is when everyone, regardless of socioeconomic status, race, ethnicity, geographic location, or other determinants of health, has a fair and just opportunity to be vaccinated. (CDC: Ensuring Vaccine Access for All People Vaccines & Immunizations | CDC)
