WHY CHOOSE McLAREN?

WHEN SHOULD I SEEK TREATMENT FOR MY WOUND?

Ask your doctor about visiting the McLaren Thumb Region Wound Care Center if:

- You have a non-healing wound.
- You have a sore with increasing pain, redness, drainage or swelling, foul odor, or a change in color.
- You have a surgical wound that has become infected or is not healing.

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR FIRST APPOINTMENT:

- A list of any medications you're currently taking as well as any allergies you're aware of
- Medical records, including radiology reports or studies
- Insurance forms or cards

HOW TO START HEALING?

When you call for your first appointment, we will ask you a few questions about your wound and your health in general. Before treatment, our team of doctors and nurses will thoroughly evaluate your wound and review your health and medical history. Tests may be conducted to tell us more about your blood flow and tissue oxygenation as well as to determine if there's any infection present. Together with your physician, we'll develop a treatment program based on your special needs. We are in constant communication with your primary care provider throughout your care.

HYPERBARIC OXYGEN THERAPY

Oxygen is essential for life and healing. Your body needs oxygen to survive. When tissue is damaged, even more oxygen is needed for healing. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy increases the amount of oxygen in your blood, which helps your body fight infection and stimulates healing.

During HBOT, the patient breathes pure oxygen in a pressurized chamber. The air pressure in the chamber is slowly and safely increased to up to three times the normal air pressure, delivering more oxygen to your wounds.

HYPERBARIC OXYGEN THERAPY (CONT'D)

After a series of treatments in a hyperbaric oxygen chamber, patients often see improved healing of chronic wounds. HBOT can be used in combination with other wound treatments. It is most commonly used to treat:

- Diabetic foot wounds
- Necrotizing soft tissue infections
- Chronic bone infections (osteomyelitis)
- Compromised skin grafts and flaps
- Crush injuries and traumatic wounds
- Radiation tissue damage
